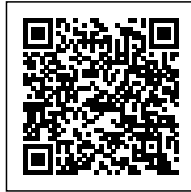


AUGUSTA ABOGADOS LAUNCHES IN BRUSSELS

"The opening of the new office in Brussels is a natural consequence of our well-known strategy of having a strong international presence. In conjunction with the opening of the office, IUROPE and Augusta Abogados have reached an agreement with CONCILIUS Europe, a European leader in the representation of business interests at EU level. The collaboration will allow the determination of comprehensive and multidisciplinary strategies in EU matters, such as the identification and processing of direct aid or issues related to Competition Law. The significant investments announced by the EU authorities for the coming years, particularly those related to economic recovery, the digitalisation of the economy and the promotion of alternative resources and energies, augur a significant increase in consultations on these issues.
