IBM AND FORD AMONG SUBSCRIBERS TO GÓMEZ-ACEBO & POMBO BLOCKCHAIN TOKENS

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Organisations including IBM, Ford, Cemex, Fundación Bancaria Ibercaja and Fundación Mutua Madrileña will be among the first subscribers to Gómez-Acebo & Pombo's new blockchain token, the firm has confirmed.



Gómez-Acebo & Pombo announced the lauch of its own cryptocurrency, the 'Pombo', earlier this year – the tokens are to be used to finance pro bono projects, including schemes helping victims of gender violence and trafficking.

The blockchain tokens will be used to fund projects for some of society's most vulnerable communities.

A Gómez-Acebo & Pombo statement said: "This initiative aims to involve institutions, companies and foundations in the social projects coordinated by the Fernando Pombo Foundation, offering the maximum transparency and guarantees provided by blockchain technology."

It continued: "This new model of fundraising, in addition to giving greater transparency and traceability to its donors, enables the, to be participants in decisions about the destination of their funds. After the success of this first issue of 'Pombos', the intention is intended to expand this project with other issues in the future, to continue advancing social responsibility."

The organisations subscribing to the 'Pombos' can choose to assign their tokens to a project led by the Fernando Pombo Foundation. The projects focus on 'Minors and Health', 'Gender Violence in Adolescents and Older Women' and 'Victims of Trafficking'.

According to Gómez-Acebo & Pombo, raising funds for the Fernando Pombo Foundation's projects through blockchain technology enables a "reduction in time and management costs and the streamlining of the flows of social responsibility that are transferred from companies to society."
