Hyatt Hotels Corporation has agreed to acquire Apple Leisure Group (ALG), a leading luxury resort-management services, travel and hospitality group, from affiliates of each of KKR and KSL Capital Partners, LLC for US\$2.7 billion in cash. The transaction is anticipated to close in the fourth quarter of 2021, subject to customary closing conditions. Hyatt expects to fund the Transaction with a combination of US\$1.0 billion of cash on hand and new financings.

ALG's hotel portfolio consists of over 33,000 rooms operating in 10 countries. Following completion of the transaction, Hyatt will offer the largest portfolio of luxury all-inclusive resorts in the world, will double its global resort footprint, will be the largest operator of luxury hotels in Mexico and the Caribbean, and will expand its European footprint by 60 per cent by extending Hyatt's brand footprint into 11 new European markets.
